Michael Zuckert received his B.A. in 1964 from Cornell University and his Ph.D. in 1974 from the University of Chicago. He is a political scientist specializing in American political thought and history, American constitutional history, law, and theory, and political philosophy. He has published extensively in those areas and is currently finishing a book on the 14th amendment, the part of the constitution that commits to equal protection of the laws, among other things.
